Dear Friends,

Today, our country takes out a day to honor mothers; the incredible women that God has chosen for each one of us to give us life. The noblest mother's task, set by God, is to conceive, bear, nourish, and bring up her children. It is the single most important task in this world! What God has entrusted to a mother is nothing less than the soul of the child. With a mother's care and with a mother's heart, she carries her children with her, 24 hours a day. It does not matter how old she is and it does not matter how old her children are - she never ceases being a mother. Even when we see mothers who are in their nineties and their children are in their seventies, it is still mother and child. And that mother continues to be a mother not only in this life, but in the next, as well. That's why we pray for our mothers who are deceased, but also know they continue to pray for us. Each one of us has learned from our own mothers what it is to be loved, taught, nourished and cherished. I suspect, for the vast majority of us, the first place we heard of Jesus was on the knee of our mother as she taught us how to pray. She taught us about Jesus; she taught us how to love God.

When we honor our earthly mothers, let us remember our heavenly mother, Mary. In the Gospel of John, it is written: "When Jesus saw his mother and the disciple there whom he loved, he said to his mother, 'Woman, behold, your son.' Then he said to the disciple, 'Behold, your mother.' And from that hour the disciple took her into his home." (John 19:26-27) Mary is our mother. We do something special for our mothers. Take them for a dinner, buy a nice gift, something to honor them and to show our gratitude. So how can we honor Mary? What can we do for her to show our appreciation?

In the Gospel of John, there is a story about a wedding at Cana of Galilee. The wine went short, and *Mary said to the servers: "Do whatever he tells you." (John 2:5)* The best way to honor Our Mother, Mary is to do what her Son, Jesus Christ, tells us. Mothers want the best for their children and Our Mother, Mary wants the best for us, as well. She knows that, by doing the will of her Son, we are to enter heaven, and what can be better than this? So, on this day, we give special thanks to each and every mother, and to our own mothers who brought us into this world and who taught us the most important lessons of life. We are grateful to our heavenly Mother who leads us to Jesus, who teaches us about Our Lord, who protects us, who guides us, who nourishes us, who prays for us to bring us to eternal life. Thanks be to God for moms, and thanks to every mom who has cooperated with God in the work of creation and created the most incredible thing: a human person with a soul, which is eternal to give glory to God.




Pray for Vocations!
