WELCOME...to any new parishioners and to those visiting. We are so glad to have you here with us today.

Dear Friends,

I had the amazing opportunity to travel with Fr. Krzysztof and 21 other pilgrims to Poland at the end of June. There are many fun things about traveling abroad: trying new food, learning about local culture, gorgeous views, and great shopping. Planning a personal vacation is fun and exciting, but going on a pilgrimage adds a deeper focus to your travels. Not only do you experience the history and life of a country, but you also focus on the deep roots of the Faith wherever you go.

We had the privilege to attend daily Mass at many churches that contained such a beautiful history. We attended Mass in the small wooden chapel at the Franciscan Monastery, the Immaculata city that was built by Fr. Maximilian Kolbe, who died at the Auschwitz Concentration Camp after he volunteered his life for another prisoner. We also had Mass at the Shrine of Jasna Gora, right in front of the Miraculous Icon, the "Black Madonna." We had Mass in several places associated with Saint John Paul II: at St. Floriana in Krakow where he was the associate pastor for two years, in the small chapel under the Cathedral on Wawel Hill, where he said his first Mass in 1946, and at the Presentation of the Blessed Virgin Mary in Wadowice, where he was baptized. On Day 10 of the trip, we had Mass over 400 feet below the ground in one of the many chapels in the Salt Mines of Wieliczka. On our last day, we experienced Mass in the Chapel of the Apparitions at the Divine Mercy Center in Lagiewniki. Saint Faustina had visions of Jesus in that chapel and convent. It is aweinspiring to think of the Saints who went before us through the doors of these churches, who sat in those pews, and who talked to God in these places.

There were other tour groups, pilgrims, and locals throughout many of the places we visited, and often others would join us at Mass or spend time in prayer. There was this intense presence of faith everywhere. Evening devotions in front of the Black Madonna was packed. The singing resonated off of the walls, and people knelt where they stood, shoulder to shoulder. It was all in Polish, but I recognized a decade of the Rosary. Isn't it amazing that, as Catholics, we have these wonderful universal prayers? You can travel over 4,000 miles from home and connect in the Faith. In every church building, people were present and Jesus was present. The Church is in Poland and the Church is present here.

St. John Paul II writes that our ability to go and do likewise in imitation of Jesus' 'washing of the disciples' feet is the "criterion by which the authenticity of our Eucharistic celebrations is judged" (Mane Nobiscum Domine [Stay with us, Lord], no. 28). "Eucharistic worship," he says, is the expression of "the love that springs up within us from the Eucharist"—that love which is "the authentic and deepest characteristic of the Christian vocation" (Dominicae Cenae, no. 5). Pope Francis reminds us: "It is in the Eucharist that all that has been created finds its greatest exaltation"; therefore, "the Eucharist is also a source of light and motivation for our concerns for the environment, directing us to be stewards of all creation" (Pope Francis, Laudato Si' [On Care for Our Common Home], no. 236)."


